**What are Natural Areas?**

Natural areas are undeveloped parcels of land such as woodlands, wetlands and prairies. These areas are considered ecologically sensitive and provide important habitat for plants and wildlife.

**What is the Land Preservation Program?**

Meridian Township's Land Preservation Program was established in 2000 to acquire, preserve, and protect natural areas throughout the township that have unique or special natural features.

**Where are the Natural Areas?**

There are over 600 acres of natural areas located throughout the township. These Natural Areas are open to the public and some of them contain pathways that are excellent for walking, cross country skiing, or bird watching. See the map for the exact locations.
